ORDER REVISING BOUNDARY OF THE NORTH FORK NOOKSACK RESEARCH NATURAL AREA

REVISION OF ESTABLISHMENT REPORT FOR NORTH FORK NOOKSACK RESEARCH NATURAL AREA

The North Fork Nooksack Research Natural Area is described in the Establishment Report dated April 10, 1934. It is located on the Glacier Ranger District, Mt. Baker National Forest, Whatcom County, Washington.

In order to provide for greater public safety in the management of this Natural Area, the boundary along the north side of the Mt. Baker Highway 542 should be relocated 225 feet from the centerline of the road.

This would remove a 200 foot strip from the Natural Area lying in parts of Sections 33, 34, 35 and 36, Township 40 North, Range 8 East, and Section 2, Township 39 North, Range 8 East, Willamette Meridian containing 88 acres. Revised acreage of Natural Area is 1,407.

The purpose in removing this strip from the area is to exclude lands where activities which will directly modify ecological processes are necessary from the standpoint of public safety.

The area within the strip will be managed in a manner which will exert a minimum of influence on the ecological conditions present in the Natural Area and to retain a strip that resembles the Natural Area as closely as possible. To accomplish this, the following practices will be followed:

- 1. Timber Management will be confined to removing trees only when they are considered a danger to the highway users. Logging within the roadside strip will be entirely by cable methods.
- 2. Commercial sales will be used when sufficient funds can be collected to accomplish debris disposal.
- 3. If item 2 is not possible, Washington State Highway Department will be permitted, after Forest Service review and approval, to remove danger trees and dispose of the debris.
- 4. Special use permits, parking areas, trail heads and signing which would tend to attract casual visitors will not be permitted.

Existing	parking areas and foot paths will be left as is.




Figure NF-1.— North Fork Nooksack Research Natural Area, Whatcom County, Washington.
